

FROM THE ASSISTANT DEAN OF GRANTS

During the past academic year, Suffolk County Community College (SCCC), the Suffolk Community College Foundation (SCCF), Suffolk Community College Association (SCCA), and Suffolk Center for the Holocaust, Diversity and Human Understanding (SCHDHU) received slightly more than \$2.6 million in grants, contracts, and other awards (see 2008-2009 Institutional Grants Awards Report, pp. 2-5). Reflecting the recent downturn in the U.S. economy, total awards declined last year by over \$1 million in comparison to the prior five years. From mid-2007 until recently, there were fewer federal and NYS funding opportunities for SCCC to apply for, several long-term funding initiatives that were suspended or terminated, and other grants which received reduced awards in 2008-09.

For example, SCCC typically receives at least 4-5 awards over \$250,000/year, yet only three met this criterion in 2008-09. Compared to 2007-08, all of these awards came in with reduced or flat funding. The 2008-09 Career & Technical Education Act (CTEA) grant (\$365,851) dipped below \$400,000 for the first time since 2000-01. The U.S. Department of Labor TEAM Community Based Job Training grant received its 3rd-year allocation of \$518,559, which was significantly lower than in 2007-08. And, the 4th-year of funding for the U.S. Department of Education TRIO-Student Support Services grant (\$268,722) remained basically flat.

In addition to declining dollars, SCCC lost several long-term funding streams. These included the end of our 10-year National Technical Institute for the Deaf project funded through the Rochester Institute of Technology, which provided professional development for sign language interpreters, and the General Motors/Raytheon automotive training project, which was active from the early 1990s through June of 2009. The U.S. Department of Health & Human Services' BRIDGE-College-to-Work program also ended in 2007-08.

Looking forward from 2009-10 toward 2010-11 and beyond, we are witnessing the appearance of many new 'economic stimulus' funding initiatives. We would like to encourage the entire college community to collaborate with us to help restore SCCC to its former grants productivity levels over next few years!
