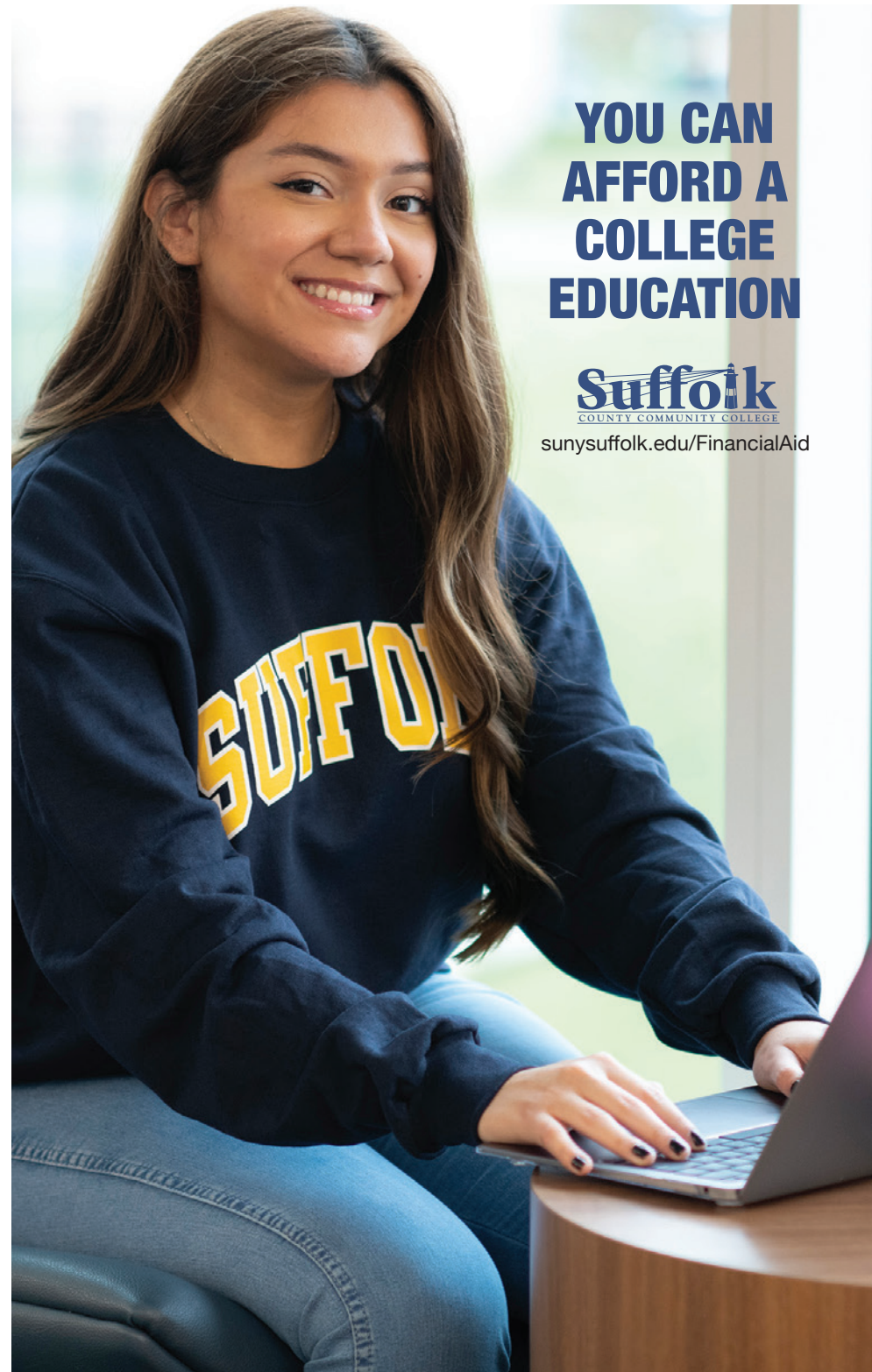

At Suffolk County Community College we are committed to helping you afford a quality education. Whether you are a new, continuing or transfer student, planning to enroll part time or full time, taking classes during the day or evening, Suffolk can help make your educational goals a reality.

Every year, Suffolk awards over \$50 million in federal and state financial aid to more than 15,000 students. By combining quality education and low tuition with financial aid opportunities, Suffolk has proven to be a leader in affordable higher education.

What is financial aid?

Financial aid can be a combination of grants, scholarships and work-study that helps you and your family afford college. Aid can also include optional student loans, but loans are not a required part of the financial aid package.

Should I apply for financial aid?

Yes, if you believe that you need assistance with college costs. We encourage all students interested in attending Suffolk to apply for admission and fill out the Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) via the web at studentaid.gov regardless of individual financial need.

Where can I go for help?

Each campus has a Financial Aid Office to assist students with the application process for all federal and state financial aid programs including PELL, the New York Excelsior Scholarship, Tuition Assistance Program (TAP), Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG), Federal Work-Study, Aid for Part-Time Study (APTS) and the William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan Program. There, you will find assistance with filing your FAFSA (Free Application For Federal Student Aid), financial aid counseling, materials and information from the Department of Education as well as New York State Higher Education.

What are the different types of federal and New York State grants and loans that are available?

Federal Grants and Loans

- ❖ **PELL Grants** ranging from \$692 to \$6,895 per academic year are granted to students demonstrating financial need. The amount of the grant is based on enrollment, income, assets, family size and the number of family members in college.
- ❖ **Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG)** can be awarded to students who demonstrate exceptional financial need. The average amount is \$400 per year.
- ❖ **The Federal Work-Study Program** provides jobs during the regular academic year and for the summer prior to entering Suffolk County Community College. Federal Work-Study positions can provide valuable experience relative to your chosen career. For example, some Work-Study students interested in careers in education are currently serving as tutors in local elementary schools.
- ❖ **The William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan Program** makes funds available directly from the U.S. Department of Education. Students applying for a loan must be enrolled at least half time (six or more credits).

New York State Grants*

- ❖ **Tuition Assistance Program (TAP)** awards are granted by the State of New York to residents who are students in attendance at colleges or universities in New York. Traditionally, this program required full-time attendance, however, effective with the 2022-2023 academic year, students enrolled at least half-time (6 credits per semester) may be eligible for awards. All students are encouraged to apply for NYS TAP even if they are unsure about their ultimate enrollment plans. Awards range from \$250 to \$5,470 per year, based on a schedule of family net income.
- ❖ **Aid For Part-Time Study (APTS)** provides grant funding to part-time students enrolled in 3-11 credits per semester. This award is administered by the college. Applicants can download the application by visiting sunysuffolk.edu/FinancialAid. The printable forms are on the left-hand navigation bar.
- ❖ **New York State Excelsior Scholarship** is available to full-time students from families with a combined federal adjusted gross income of \$125,000 or less. Students must enroll and earn 30 credits per year for renewal, and must plan to live and work in New York State following graduation for the length of time they participate in the scholarship program. The scholarship covers full tuition, less any other grants and scholarships the applicant has received.
- ❖ **New York State Part-Time Scholarship Program** is a scholarship available to part-time students. This scholarship is in addition to the existing award.
